



SRUC Appoints Colin MacEwan as Director of Commercialisation & Innovation

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Scotland's Rural College (SRUC) is pleased to announce the appointment of Colin MacEwan to the new senior post of Director of Commercialisation and Innovation.

Colin is currently head of the Norwich-based British Beet Research Organisation (BBRO), a position he has held for the past six years. When he joins SRUC later this summer, he will be responsible for leading the development and implementation of a growth-focused commercialisation strategy. He will be a member of SRUC's Senior Leadership Team.

Key priorities within his remit include championing an entrepreneurial culture across SRUC; maximising the development of new products, intellectual property and services to attract new customers, partners and investors; and driving effective business diversification and income generation.

SRUC's Principal and Chief Executive Professor Wayne Powell said: "As described in our <u>new strategic vision document</u>, a crucial element of expanding SRUC's reach and impact is the need for us to be far more commercial and entrepreneurial, allowing us to maximise opportunities for sustainable growth. We have therefore introduced the new executive leadership role of Director of Commercialisation and Innovation to lead in this important area.

"We are really delighted to have attracted someone of Colin's calibre and experience to the position. We are confident that he will continue to build on his long track record of success and innovation within senior, commercially-focused agricultural roles and we look forward to welcoming him to SRUC."

Colin said: "There can be no doubt that future of Scottish agriculture will depend upon its capacity to innovate. I feel privileged to be in the position to help SRUC play a central role in supporting that innovation process and in so doing maintain and enhance Scotland's global reputation as an agricultural nation.
